Our Purpose

Fostering research in the history of the Stanley and allied families, and publishing genealogical research. Our focus is on the Quaker Stanleys of Hanover Co., VA, starting with the first known ancestor Thomas¹ Stanley, and his three known sons: James² Stanley (baptized 1688), Thomas² Stanley Jr (baptized 1689), and John² Stanley (baptized 1691), and their descendants.

Records show that Thomas¹ and his sons lived in New Kent County, Virginia in the 1680's, later moving to present

day Hanover County, Virginia in the early 1700's. They were active Quakers, helping to establish the Cedar Creek Meeting which played a key role in the early antislavery movement.
